

DRUG ABUSE POLICY

The Department of Transportation (DOT) has established regulations that require transportation industry employers to establish and implement anti-drug and alcohol misuse prevention programs. These regulations are comprehensive and affect virtually every company in the transportation industry. Pre-employment, random, periodic, reasonable cause/suspicion, post-accident, return-to-duty, follow-up tests for marijuana, cocaine, phencyclidine, amphetamines, opiates and alcohol must be conducted on employees who operate or work on aircraft, trucks, and other transportation equipment. The anti-drug regulations forbid any company to knowingly employ any individual in a covered safety/sensitive position who has failed a urine drug test or alcohol test (utilizing an approved device) or has refused to submit to such a test if that individual performs work that might affect the safe operation of public transportation equipment.

Air Services, Inc. (The Company) strongly supports this DOT anti-drug program. We recognize the pervasiveness of drug and alcohol use in American society today, the harm these drugs can do to individuals and the very real threat to public safety impaired workers represent.

We are committed to producing a quality service and product with absolute integrity and the assurance this commitment provides our customers and the traveling public. Because of this, we have implemented a drug testing program to detect and deter drug abuse in compliance with applicable DOT and FAA Rules. Drug abuse and alcohol misuse in the workplace will not be tolerated and no employee who tests positive will be allowed to work in a safety-sensitive function.

The Company policy and procedures for implementing and carrying out this testing program are located in the Company Administrative Office. These documents provide detailed procedures on program requirements, administration, education, alcohol testing, collection of urine samples, laboratory testing and medical review. All documents are available for review by any employee upon request.

We encourage employees who believe they may have a problem to seek help before their drug abuse or alcohol misuse affects their work or before they test positive. We have posted substance abuse help hot-line posters in the workplace and encourage employees with a problem to call the number and ask for help.

SUMMARY: We support and are committed to the DOT anti-drug and alcohol misuse programs. Drug abuse and alcohol misuse will not be tolerated. Toward this end, our drug and alcohol testing program is designed to detect, deter and eliminate drug abuse and alcohol misuse from the workplace.

- d. Limitations and Provisions.
 - (1) Antidrug and Alcohol Misuse Prevention Program inspections and enforcement activity will be conducted by the Drug Abatement Division. Questions regarding these programs should be directed to the Drug Abatement Division.
 - (2) The certificate holder is responsible for updating this operations specification when any of the following changes occur:
 - (a) Location or phone number where the Antidrug and Alcohol Misuse Prevention Program Records are kept.
 - (b) If the certificate holder's number of safety-sensitive employees goes to 50 and above, or falls below 50 safety-sensitive employees.
 - (3) The certificate holder with 50 or more employees performing a safety-sensitive function on January 1 of the calendar year must submit an annual report to the Drug Abatement Division of the FAA.
 - (4) The certificate holder with fewer than 50 employees performing a safety-sensitive function on January 1 of any calendar year must submit an annual report upon request of the Administrator, as specified in the regulations.


